



The European authorities have set strict guidelines for the import of plant material (leaves, stems) into the European Community. You can send plant material without a permit. In case of research for plant pathology but you need a copy of the MLII certificate. This certificate can be found here If you send plant material for analyses of nutrient deficiency this certificatie is not needed!

Eurofins Agro can only receive plant samples sent from outside the European Community if these are sent in compliance with these guidelines. If not, delays will occur or the authorities will destroy the samples.

Please take the following steps into account:

1) Send the samples in a unbreakable, leek proof bag or bottle in a closed/sealed robust box. Be sure that the package will not damage during transport and plant material can't get lost.

2) Add on the outside of the box:

- Pro forma invoice.
- MLII certificate 'Beschikking invoer gewas TRC NVWA_2018_1045' (in case of plant pathology)
- Product description, be as specific as possible:
 - English and Botanic/Latin name of the plant
 - Part of the plant (leave, stem, etc.)
 - Amount of plant material.
- If applicable: Description possible harmful organism.

3) Write on the package in well-readable letters:

Import Destructive Research (plant material)
DO NOT OPEN
